We worked with local artists whose livelihoods were damaged by Covid. They gave pop up concerts where we could talk about the work of WRCAG, at St Margaret's church, Woodlawn Court and in the streets of Whalley Range. We took concerts online and pioneered the Zoom music room...where people could buy personal concerts from talented musicians direct to their sofas. There were many hundreds of visitors to the arts pages of the Build Back Greener website (https://www.whalleyrangebbg.org/the-arts) to bring work to local artists.

WRCAG members are partnering the CELEBRATE CONNECTIONS festival to highlight local music and arts activities and to build on the valuable work of the covid mutual aid groups in building strong community links that will help us to lessen the effects of climate change.

The commemorative Covid Curve of snowdrops that we are hoping to plant in Alex Park will provide more opportunities to talk about the work of WRCAG to build community connections and to emphasise our links to the natural world.
