
# WRCF Clean and Safe Report August 2020







The Whalley Range Community Forum (WRCF) has been running since 1995 and is a small volunteer-led charity based at the JNR8 Youth & Community Centre on Cromwell Avenue in Whalley Range.

Due to the current situation with the Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic, the Forum unfortunately had to close the JNR8 building from the end of February 2020 - suspending all activities and classes.

We normally run community classes and activities for physical and mental wellbeing, including women-only and older people's groups. We hold residents' meetings, events, talks and classes around food health and nutrition and provide foodbank vouchers.

To support our Whalley Range residents we successfully applied for funding from Forever Manchester, We Love Manchester and MCC to provide a **free** Clean and Safe pack of non-food household cleaning products and personal care items for people in the community - carefully packed in line with safety guidance.

Because of the pandemic, some people have found it difficult to buy some essential items: maybe they are a carer, maybe they can't go out to the shops as they are isolating/shielding or scared, maybe they are struggling to pay for things - or maybe they are too embarrassed to ask people to get them personal items.



We also provide some extras on request: e.g. denture fixative, period pack, incontinence pads. If people would like any of these items added to the pack, or there is something else you would like us to try to get for them we asked them to confidentially get in touch by phone or email. ## The project was fundraised and facilitated by the Whalley Range Community Forum.

We worked with a range of Partners to identify people who would benefit: the criteria was loosely based around vulnerability, poverty, mental health issues, shielding, self-isolating. And people forced to live apart from friends and family who needed some extra care.

Also for people nervous about leaving their homes, those who had a lack of family/friends support and those who were very isolated - having lost their support systems, access to their social groups and people struggling with loneliness and depression. Some were couples who were self-isolating/shielding together and didn't like to ask neighbours to purchase what may be perceived as non-essential' items – but the items included domestic cleaning and personal hygiene items – which are important for people's peace of mind and self-esteem.

One of the residents we supported had just moved into the area into a housing scheme and the sudden lockdown affected her finances and left her struggling with benefit changes.

We distributed the packs to a wide range of people of all ages/sexes and faiths/cultures.

As the project was delivered by the WRCF - a well-known and established small local charity - people felt confident in contacting us/referring people. The newly formed Covid-19 mutual aid and WhatsApp neighbours/street groups were invaluable in identifying 'hidden' people who were struggling. Promoting the message 'We're all in this together' meant that people were not as worried about reaching out.

A local housing scheme has a number of residents with poor mental and physical long-term health conditions. Since delivering the pack to several of these residents, the scheme manager has signed up to our mailing list. We send information bulletins out – and a recent bulletin featured a request for people to make non-medical reusable face masks for the local older community– and several of these residents have signed up to the project, to give back and keep busy during lockdown.

Distributed to:

- Isolated older people and those who were shielding
- People who attended our social groups and were isolated and struggling with depression
- Local school families who were identified as in need by school staff
- Local homeless young women's hostel
- Women of various ages who struggled to buy sanitary and personal products
- People with health conditions who were too embarrassed to ask family/volunteers for personal products
- Residents across Whalley Range identified as in need by residents' groups, neighbours and MCC response
- Self-referral from residents who were struggling mentally and financially
- People living in 3 Whalley Range over 50's housing schemes who were shielding/self-isolating and worried about leaving their homes
- New arrivals to Whalley Range pre and during the initial stages of the pandemic: social worker and self-referrals
- people with health issues/disabilities, those financially struggling as identified by scheme managers and neighbours
- People struggling with deteriorating mental health and unable to leave home
- Older Asian Men's support group who met regularly pre-covid
- Residents identified by neighbours who had lost their support networks
- Whalley Range residents with long-term health conditions: packs distributed by local pharmacy along with prescriptions
- Resident with disability and anxiety: his car broke down so he couldn't shop and was too anxious to request help (given additional support)
- Foodbank users: 15 packs donated to Manchester South Central Foodbank to distribute to Whalley Range Foodbank recipients
- 15 packs delivered to recipients of the free 'Food Fantastic' meal initiative for vulnerable residents by Tibetan Kitchen – delivered by the Chorlton Bike Delivery team
- 5 residents who had returned home from hospital
- Older people who are shielding and or isolated supported by a resident's group
